The Organising Committee of the 2026 NOTSA meeting are pleased to announce that registration is now open for this year's meeting to be held on Friday 6th and Saturday 7th November 2026 with the Training Day on Sunday 8th November.

This year we welcome Dr Yoon-Hee Cha who is an Associate Professor in the Department of Neurology at the University of Minnesota. Her current work focuses on extracranial venous compression as the pathology behind vestibular syndromes including vestibular migraine, cervicogenic dizziness, mal de débarquement syndrome, and those that fall in between diagnostic categories.

The meeting will be held over two days which will cover the latest in research and clinical practice. The Training Day will incorporate lectures on vestibular function and dysfunction.

GUEST SPEAKER



Dr Yoon-Hee Cha

Dr. Yoon-Hee Cha is a Board certified Neurologist with subspecialty training in Neurotology. She is an Associate Professor in the Department of Neurology at the University of Minnesota. She received her undergraduate degree from Stanford University, medical degree from Mayo Medical School, internship training at Brigham and Women's Hospital, neurology training at the University of California San Francisco, and neurotology fellowship training at the University of California Los Angeles.

Her past work includes functional neuroimaging and non-invasive brain stimulation to study the central manifestations of disorders such as mal de débarquement syndrome and other causes of persistent oscillating vertigo. She has performed research using fMRI, PET, EEG, transcranial magnetic stimulation, and transcranial electrical current stimulation.

Her current work focuses on extracranial venous compression as the pathology behind vestibular syndromes including vestibular migraine, cervicogenic dizziness, mal de débarquement syndrome, and those that fall in between diagnostic categories. These disorders typically follow periods of inflammation, trauma, musculoskeletal degeneration, or postural strain with venous compression being a unifying pathology for many pain related vestibular syndromes. She focuses on non-invasive methods to treat extracranial venous outflow obstruction such as physical therapy, upper cervical spine alignment, and neurotoxin injections for muscular entrapment of upper body veins as therapeutic options before surgery or stents.

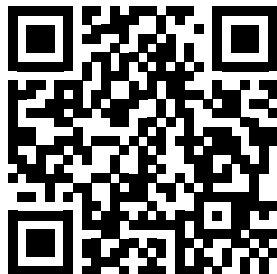

When submitting, please indicate your preferred presentation format:

A) Oral Presentation (15 minutes)

Selected abstracts will be presented as a 15-minute oral presentation, including time for questions. This format is suited to completed research projects or substantial bodies of work.

B) Rapid Fire Case Report (5 minutes)

Concise, high-yield presentations highlighting unique, challenging, or educational clinical cases. Presentations will be strictly timed at 5 minutes.

C) Poster Presentation

Posters will be displayed throughout the meeting. This format is ideal for preliminary research, audits, or case series.

Submission Guidelines:

Abstracts should include the following:

- Contact details to include -title, first name, surname, affiliation, state or country for the submitting author
- Title, first name, surname for any co-authors
- Abstract title (maximum 20 words)
- Abstract (maximum 200 words)

Please indicate your preferred presentation format (A, B, or C) at submission

Submissions may be reassigned to an alternative format at the discretion of the review committee
